- 🦁 Sexual and reproductive health (SRH) services are available so women can deliver safely and access contraception.
- People in need have access to lifesaving gender-based violence (GBV) services and the necessary measures are in place to mitigate the risk of GBV throughout humanitarian responses.
- Medical supplies and commodities are available, including for menstrual hygiene management.
- The humanitarian response is informed by strong data and evidence.
- The specific needs of women, adolescent girls and young people are addressed, including mental health and psychosocial support.
